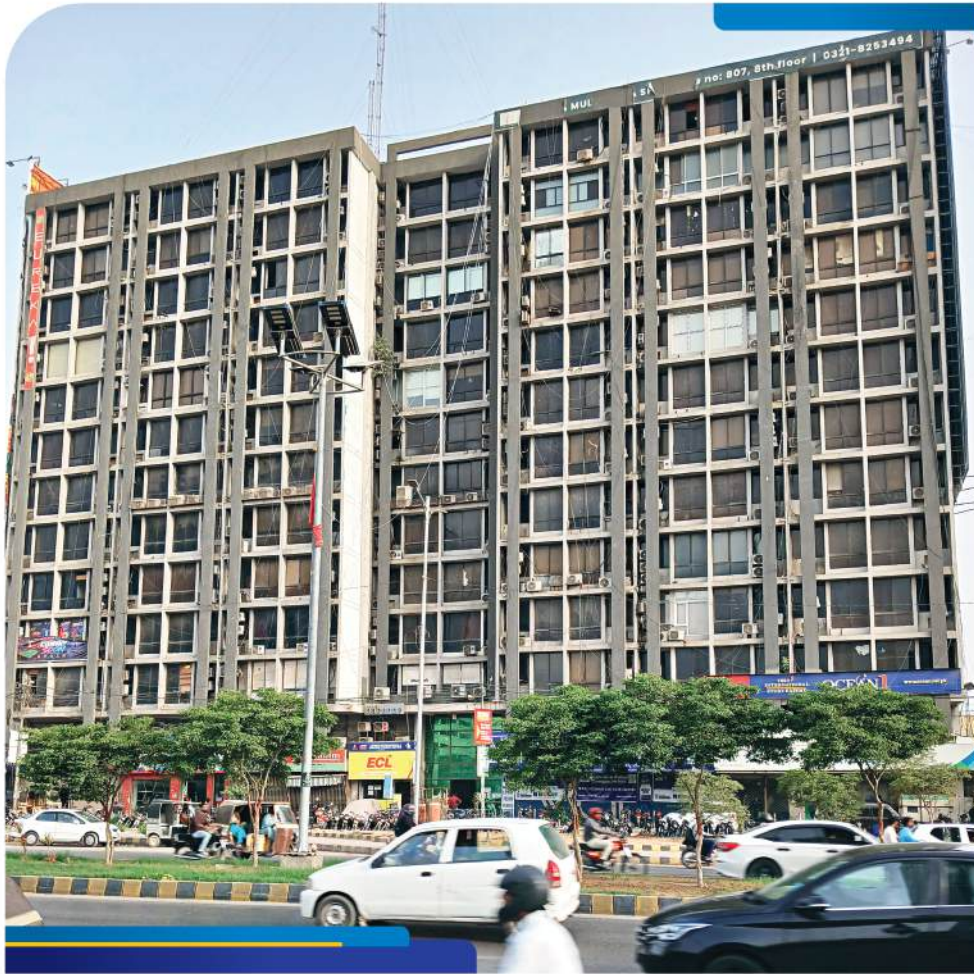

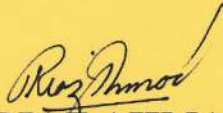

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This licence is granted to the trade organisation under Section 3 of the Trade Organisations Act, 2013 and is subject to provisions of rules made thereunder, Trade Organisations Rules, 2013, the government laws, rules, regulations and instructions issued by the Federal Government and Regulator of Trade Organisations from time to time.

This licence is further subject to the following terms and conditions:

- (i) The trade organisation shall henceforth be governed under the new Memorandum and Articles of Association as authenticated by the Federal Government and Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan within such time as notified in this behalf. Upon authentication of the new Memorandum and Articles of Association by the Federal Government and SECP, the existing memorandum shall become inoperative and of no legal consequence.
- (ii) The trade organisation shall always be in possession of a valid National Tax Number and filing statutory income tax returns, if applicable.

Any change in the rules, procedures and laws subsequently promulgated by the Federal Government in relation to trade organisations shall be deemed to be a condition attached to this licence.

Without prejudice to the provisions of Section 7 of the Trade Organisations Act, 2013 the violation of any of the terms and conditions of the licence shall make the licence liable to cancellation by the Federal Government.

INTRODUCTION

A trade organization is a voluntary, membership based, business organization that serves its members' collective interests. It works in many ways for the benefit of its members and of the country at large. It works through networking and learning process, employer-employee relationship, interaction with government agencies and publication of useful and informative literature. It also focuses its attention on research, subsidized consultancy and referral services, standardization, accreditation and policy advocacy.

In a democratic, market-driven economy, government can either help or hurt the expansion of business enterprises. The role of associations is to make certain that the government encourages business growth. A premier organization should thus build a comprehensive framework aimed at identifying, analyzing and improving laws and regulations that affect its business members. Influencing the passage of better laws or helping to repeal unfair regulations are very vital and laudable roles of associations.

Government can negatively influence businesses in many ways. High taxes imposed by anti-business governments, take away investment capital and slow down the creations of jobs. Unnecessary regulations increase the costs of producing a product or service. Slow-moving or corrupt bureaucracies hinder a business ability to

take advantage of market opportunities and changes.

Obstacles are placed in the way of business's ability to create new jobs by unfriendly or unenlightened governmental officials. Often these obstacles are caused by ignorance, wrong perception or differing views of world affairs by political leaders. Such unfortunate obstacles can cause unemployment, high import and export duties, heavy taxation, unnecessary environmental regulations, impractical health and safety laws, unrealistic land use policies, costly utility regulations, capricious consumer protection laws, corrupt procurement and contracting practices by governmental agencies, lack of protection for intellectual property and many other anti-business policies. The list is endless.

A trade organization helps to bring about desired changes in legislation, rules and regulations, legal decisions, policies, committee action and institutional practices through effective policy advocacy, in an effort to influence public policy through various forms of persuasive communications by stakeholders. A trade organization is proactive in shaping such policies and initiatives which can benefit the sector, and puts forward to the government well-researched, cogently argued cases – in nutshell, a trade organization is respected as a credible and representative advocate for its sector.

Having this vision, Pakistan Knitwear & Sweater Exporters Association (PAKSEA) focused on providing high-quality service to members; policy advocacy for reducing the cost of doing business and providing the level playing field; advocacy on policy issues with Federal, Provincial and City governments; increase in membership base; closer interaction with other associations, chambers and Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FPCCI) at large; close liaisons with officials of all concerned ministries, government departments and agencies etc by formation of effective and powerful subcommittees and representative delegations.

It is affiliated with the Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FPCCI).

committee action and institutional practices through effective policy advocacy, in an effort to influence public policy through various forms of persuasive communications by stakeholders. It considers their concerns on problems and issues confronting knitwear and sweater exporters and to devise ways and means for tackling and resolving the same. It is, in fact, an interlocutor of the knitwear industry.

Hence, our Association has the distinct honour of serving its members by issuance of Electronic Certificate of Origin (ECO) as well as Electronic Visa Recommendation Certificate.

Disseminating trade-related information through circulars and arranging consultative sessions and training programmes are another special features of our Association. We maintain Association's website quite regularly and keep our membership well informed of its activities, events, functions, plans and progress.

DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2025-26

Respectable members of the Association,

You all are most warmly welcomed at this 39th Annual General Meeting of Pakistan Knitwear & Sweater Exporters Association (PAKSEA).

This was the second and the last year of our biennial term in office, so, it will be more appropriate to take start by expressing our heartfelt gratitude and extreme indebtedness to you all for extending outright support and helping hands in performing our duties and enabling us to make our tenure of office a success.

Today, we are going to retire from our responsibilities and passing the stick of command to our successors. At this occasion, it is our pleasant duty to present before you an account of our activities and targets we could achieve during our tenure of office.

Although the entire period of time remained unfavourable, we tried our best to maintain the glaring traditions of our trade body to a greater extent and did what could possibly be done in these crucial circumstances prevailed in the country for all the time.

Exports continue to decline year after year with little investment entering the sector. Over 150 units have closed down due to withdrawal of incentives. Despite the government's much publicized Uraan programme targeting US\$60 billion in

exports, Commerce ministry admitted that the country's exports remain stagnant, citing anti-export taxes, high energy and financing costs and structural hurdles that increase the cost of doing business in the country. In a meeting of the National Assembly Standing Committee on Commerce, a calling attention notice regarding the country's exports was taken up, highlighting that export earnings have remained stagnant at US\$ 25-30 billion for nearly two decades.

As pointed out by a noted economic journalist while commenting on proposals being sought by the government to revive the economy, "the days of cheap energy and cheap money are over. Nothing good has ever come out of the proposals the business community has been bringing to the government over the past half a century."

According to him, "Businessmen are not seeking handouts. What they truly want is a level playing field, with sustainable long-term policies implemented by the government. With successful businesses, the country will experienced a surge in job creation, generation of foreign exchange, GDP growth and higher tax collection. The only viable path to Pakistan's economic survival is facilitation of the private sector - and it is the government's duty to deliver."

Fellow members,

After certain amendments taken place in the Trade Organizations Act & Rules 2013, it was required by the Regulator & Director General of

Trade Organizations to amend and update the Memorandum & Articles of Association accordingly and get it approved by him as well as from the Securities & Exchange Commission of Pakistan. This was complied with accordingly and the approved Memorandum & Articles of Association is placed on the Association's website: www.paksea.com at "Formation Documents" link.

Dear members,

As you know, the elections in the Association are now held on all seats of the executive committee and the tenure of the office-bearers and executive members is of two years' time. Further, the incumbent office-bearers and members of the Executive committee are not eligible to contest the upcoming election.

Therefore, the entire team for the next biennial term is anew and it reflects rising interest of members in the affairs of the Association. It's a good sign indeed. Me and my colleagues assure them of our full support and for all time assistance and guidance and wish them all the best in days to come.

We have maintained the pace of development and standards of membership service for all the time and have played an active role in shaping trade policies, export development and regional cooperation. Digitization of internal operations and membership services received our

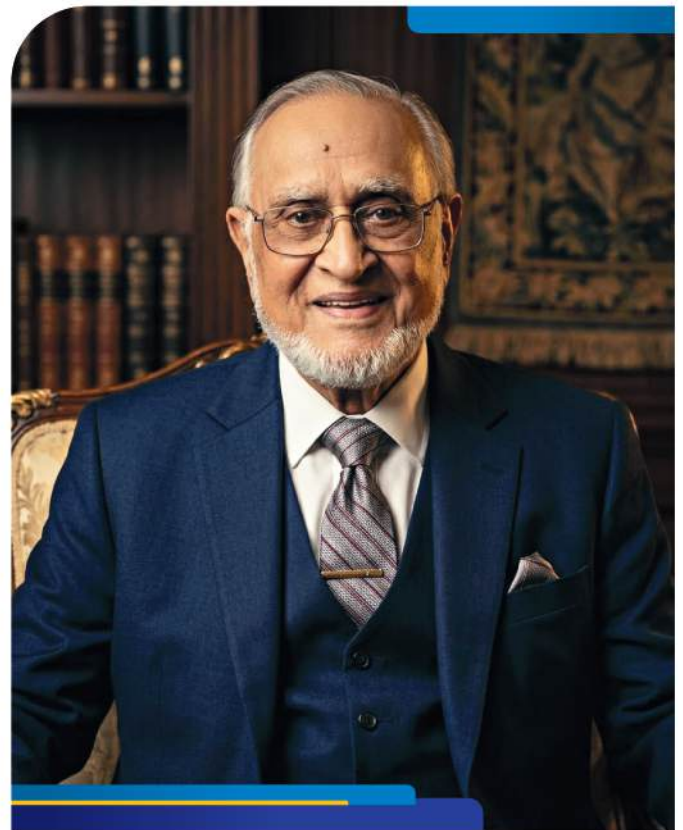
